

**CHIPPEWA TOWNSHIP
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
REGULAR MONTHLY MEETING
MINUTES
APRIL 18, 2018**

The Chippewa Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly Regular Meeting on Wednesday, April 18, 2018 at 7:30 p.m. Present were Chairman Jim Bouril, Supervisor Nancy Lamey, Supervisor Mark Hoenig, Manager Mark Taylor, Assistant Secretary/Treasurer Rich Bebout, Solicitor George Verlihay, Code Enforcement Officer Dawna Pella, and Administrative Assistant Cindy Clark.

Chairman Bouril called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance.

VISITORS

Chief Berchtold, Gabe Gargiulo and Kate Gargiulo attended. Mr. and Mrs. Gargiulo, of 251 Center Street, voiced complaints about street parking on their narrow road. Mr. Gargiulo said he had already called and spoken to Manager Taylor. Mr. and Mrs. Gargiulo said some vehicles in their neighborhood have not been moved since Christmas. They said the neighbors have a place to park off of the street and also a garage, but instead park on the street, and some are facing the wrong direction. Neighbors have also placed a deer salt lick close to the road and people are hitting or nearly hitting deer. Mr. Gargiulo said that he would like someone from the Township to speak to the neighbors about the problems there. Chairman Bouril said that Manager Taylor and Chief Berchtold can check into these problems and get back to the Gargiulos. He added that many times talking to people can solve the problems without having to pass ordinances.
