MINUTES  
of the  
JUNE 10, 2020  
AGENDA MEETING**

The Chippewa Township Board of Supervisors held their monthly Agenda Meeting at 10 a.m. on Wednesday, June 10, 2020. Present were Chairman Jim Bouril, Supervisor Nancy Lamey, Supervisor Dan Woodske, Manager Mark Taylor, Assistant Secretary/Treasurer Rich Bebout, Code Enforcement Officer Dawna Pella and Administrative Assistant Cindy Clark.

Chairman Jim Bouril brought the meeting to order.

**VISITORS**

Chief Hermick, Recreation Director Mark Hoenig, and Road Foreman Eric Chaffee attended.

**MANAGER**

Township Manager Mark Taylor had listed the following items on the agenda for discussion or action:

1. Darlington Road Paving Project:

Manager Taylor said that this is a big project. He said he already met with the Road Foreman on this and he started filling out the forms. He got some pre-estimates. He asked the Board if they would authorize the advertising for the bid opening to be done in July. He told them to let him know if they have any questions.

**MS. LAMEY MOVED TO AUTHORIZE** the advertising and bid opening for the Darlington Road Paving Project at the July Agenda Meeting. Mr. Woodske seconded the motion and with no further discussion the motion carried.

2. LPR Camera - Route 51 and Darlington Road:

Chief Hermick said he can't emphasize enough how much these cameras have helped to solve crimes in Chippewa. He said they are amazing and he gave some examples of how they have been used to help the police with thefts, pursuits, etc. He said the company is available to be contacted and they do a great job servicing the cameras.

**MR. WOODSKE MOVED TO PROCEED** with the purchase of a camera for the Route 51 and Darlington Road location. Ms. Lamey seconded the motion. Chairman Bouril asked if the police will eventually ask for additional cameras for other locations and he was told that the original plan called for a future one to be placed at Braden School Road. Chief Hermick said that they may also check into getting cameras for the cruisers at some point. After this discussion the motion carried.

3. Playground Proposals for Wright Fields:

Manager Taylor gave the Supervisors two playground proposals to look over. He said different ideas including a splash pad were kicked around but at the present time it seems that constructing a playground is the most feasible. He said there is nothing for the siblings of the athletes to do while the sporting events are going on at Veterans Park.

4. Young Lungs at Play Resolution:

Recreation Director Mark Hoenig spoke about the Young Lungs at Play information that had been forwarded to each of the Supervisors prior to the meeting. Free signs are available to let visitors know that our parks are tobacco-free. A resolution regarding this program will be presented at next week's meeting.

5. Ordinance #229 Recreation Fee:

Manager Taylor said that Chippewa Trails was made aware of this fee from the beginning. There was discussion concerning payments that might be made in phases, and the possibility of having a gazebo, walking trail, or small playground and placing values on these items. The Supervisors were not sure about the walking trail suggestion.

6. Term Expiration of Dennis Rousseau:

Dennis Rousseau's term on the Chippewa Township Property Maintenance Code Board will expire on June 17<sup>th</sup>. This will be handled at next week's meeting.

**MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS**

Walmart is applying for a liquor license transfer.

With nothing further to come before the Board, the meeting was adjourned at 10:32 a.m.
